

- Use glue or tape to stick the leaves in place, overlapping as you go.
- Color with gold paint, crayons, markers, or colored pencils.
- Now you're ready to enter Rome as a victorious champion!




Virtual Exploration - Stonehenge

Science Activity - Pencil Catapult


Ancient cities were built with tall stone walls to protect the inhabitants within and keep invading armies out. For ages, the only way to penetrate these walls was to send an army above or below them, until the invention of the Catapult. Using tension created by bending the arm of the device backwards, an incredible amount of potential energy was stored within these devices. Then that energy was suddenly released, causing the arm to fling projectiles great distances, to shatter walls of cities and allow invading armies within.
