relate to Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.



The Breiter-Palm Park renovation is nearing completion with a projected opening in spring 2022. The resulting ADA-accessible playground will serve as a gathering place for children of all abilities to enjoy.

The new playground will be a destination location accessible to all families. Its pour-in-place rubber surface is ADA compliant, making it possible for anyone in a wheelchair or mobility device to access playground amenities.

Playgrounds such as the one being installed at Breiter-Palm are essential to providing the opportunity for children to play and practice key developmental skills. In addition to the playground structure itself, the new park will have abundant play components that promote sensory, motor, cognitive, and social-emotional skills, as well as strength. The following equipment, made by Landscape Structures, is being installed: a Rhapsody™ Kettle Drum, Rhapsody™ Vito Metallophone, Rhapsody™ Cascata Bells, a Bobble Rider, Sway Fun Glider, We-Saw, WhirlyQ™ Spinner, and Cozy Dome™ DB.

- A chance to ask questions and share concerns
- Explanation of the registration process
